Learning Conversations

Class	
Nursery	The children have had lots of fun showing us 'under', 'on top' and 'at the side' of different objects. Ask your child to show you at home.
Reception	Discuss with your child the types of animals we might see at the York- shire Wildlife Park. Are there any animals they haven't heard of before?
Year 1	Discuss what 'height', 'length' and 'weight' mean. We will be starting to talk about weight and mass this week. Ask your child for ideas of things we could weigh.
Year 2	We will be learning about time– o'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past. Please discuss these times and look at a clock with your child.
Year 3	This week we will be looking at our local area in Geography. Can you explore the local area and find a place of importance and interest.
Year 4	This week we are thinking about the main character in our story, Philippe Petit. Ask your child: What can you remember about him? How do you think he felt while he was doing his walk between the towers?
Year 5	This week we will be developing our ideas for our own version of The Tear Thief in English. Talk about your ideas and the different scenarios you will use.
Year 6	What is the past and present progressive tense? What does 'slew' mean?
