



Talking Time Vocabulary development is very important. By the age of 2 and a half, children should be speaking in simple sentences and by the age of 6, children should know 14,000 words!


Conversations and reading help develop vocabulary much more extensively that watching TV or being on computers. Please use the words in the stars and ask them what new words they have

learnt each day and what they mean.




Nursery

We will be looking at the story of Goldilocks and the three bears and learning about bears. Our colour this week is white. Can you encourage your child to notice white objects around the home?




Year 1

Talk about different plants around where you live. What do they look like? What are they called? Do you know the names for parts of a plant?




What happens to ice when you leave it in a pot on the side? Why?




Year 2

Last week we were learning about shapes and the children found it quite tricky. Please talk about the relationship between 2D and 3D shapes.




Year 3
