
We were delighted to receive this letter from a family this week.


Positive adults have encouraged the children to be relaxed and it takes their mind off what's happening in the world.


"The adults have helped us relax and forget about what's happening in the world for a bit."








In art we used Quentin Blake as an inspiration and did artist studies of his work. The results were fantastic! Next week we're creating self portraits in the style of Quentin Blake.



In science we investigated which sugar was the best to use based on how quickly they dissolve. Caster sugar was the quickest (we decided it was because of the smaller particles) and the children decided cubes were the slowest because they need to break down out of the cube before they can all dissolve.

Year 1

Year 1 have had a great first week back at school. We have been learning in two bubbles and have started our new book Jack and the Beanstalk. We have had a go at planting our own magic beans and will be turning these into a scene from the story. During the sunny first half of this week, we have been out and about searching for natural materials to create some sculptures and art with. We also had a go at painting and printing using some of these materials. I hope those of you who have been learning at home are all well and everyone at school is looking forward to seeing you as soon as possible.













Reception

In Reception we have been starting a new topic about plants. The book we are looking at in English is Jack and the Beanstalk and we have even planted our own magic beans!
