Year 6 and Year 2 pupils will be undertaking statutory assessments next week. It is essential that they have plenty of early nights, attend school every day and arrive on time. Year 6 can arrive at 8:30am, Monday- Thursday.

### PE kit

Thank you for equipping your children with their PE kit for the whole day on the day they have PE. We are currently trialling this idea, and if it works well we will continue for the remainder of the summer term. If it creates difficulties, we will revert to our previous system.

Pupils need to be wearing their school PE kit- white T-shirt or polo shirt, dark coloured shorts/jogging bottoms/leggings/skort. If pupils need an additional top, they can wear their school jumper, sweatshirt, fleece or cardigan. Pupils should not be wearing hoodies. Footwear can be plimsolls or trainers. Pupils can come to school in their school shoes and change into their plimsolls if you prefer.

### Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations

We will be celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> May in school. The children will be carrying out Jubilee activities during that week, which will culminate in a Jubilee street party lunch (outside, weather permitting), followed by a dance presentation and kite flying on the field. Pupils can come to school on that day wearing red, white, blue, or a mixture of these colours. For pupils who do not like dressing up, school uniform is also part of this colour scheme and will be perfectly fine to wear.

## Parking outside school?

### Park safely • Park legally

- **DO NOT** stop or park near a school entrance keep off school keep clear markings
- **DO NOT** double park to pick up or drop off children from vehicles
- **DO** consider parking further away from the school and walking the last 5 or 10 minutes
- **DO** consider local residents and whether they have immediate access onto and off their driveway
- **DO** remember that people in wheelchairs or using push chairs may need to pass by your car on the pavement.

The police can remove your unattended vehicle if you cause an obstruction. This means blocking a driveway or a path even for a short amount of time.

Civil Enforcement Officers can issue you with a penalty charge notice for stopping on school keep clear/entrance markings so keep them clear.

### Please park in a safe and legal manner and consider others when leaving your vehicle.

## Do not park on the pavement



## No excuse - your car is putting pedestrians at risk

- **Don't block the pavement** - allow at least a 'double buggy' width for people to use it safely.
- **Consider people who are blind, partially sighted, elderly, infirm, mobility scooters users and adults with prams** - they shouldn't need to step into the road because you've parked selfishly.
- **Park better next time** - in a safe and legal manner and consider others when leaving your vehicle.
- **Pavements are for people** - help keep pedestrians safe or risk prosecution and your vehicle being towed away.
